

HISTORY

With tremendous volunteer effort and great generosity, the Aquidneck Land Trust purchased Oakland Forest and Meadow in 2000, saving the old-growth American Beech forest and meadow from development into 38 condominiums.

A short walking path meanders through the 30 acre site, which includes unique old-growth beech trees and other hard-woods, meadow habitat, and the remnants of a nineteenth century gentleman's farm estate.
